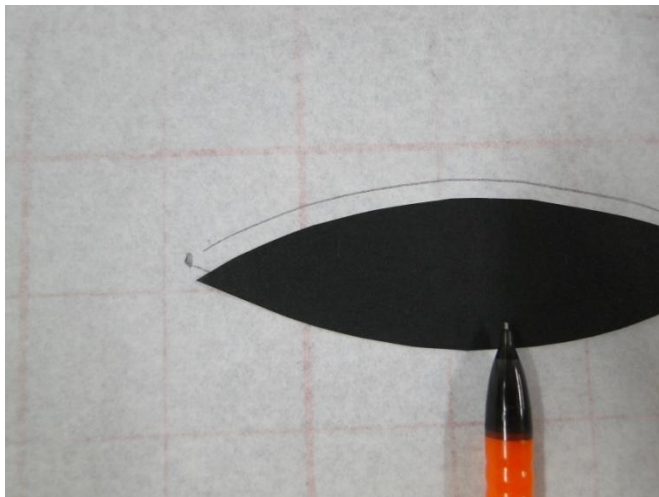
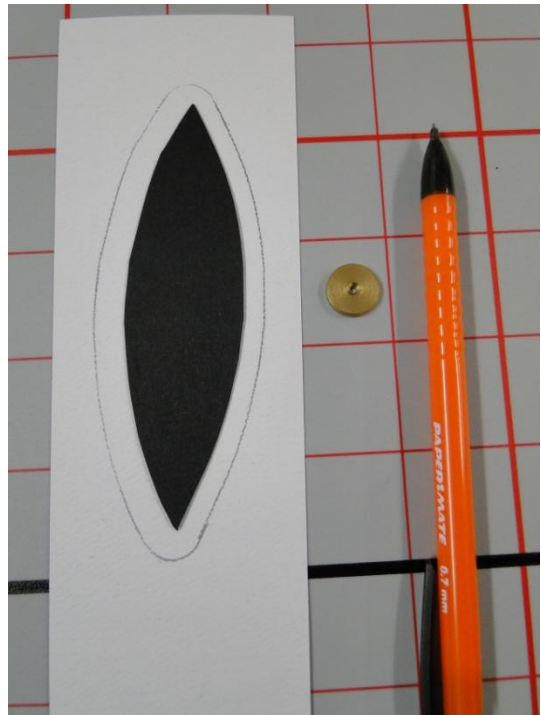


*I Have A Notion*

*Pattern: Jacobs Coat*

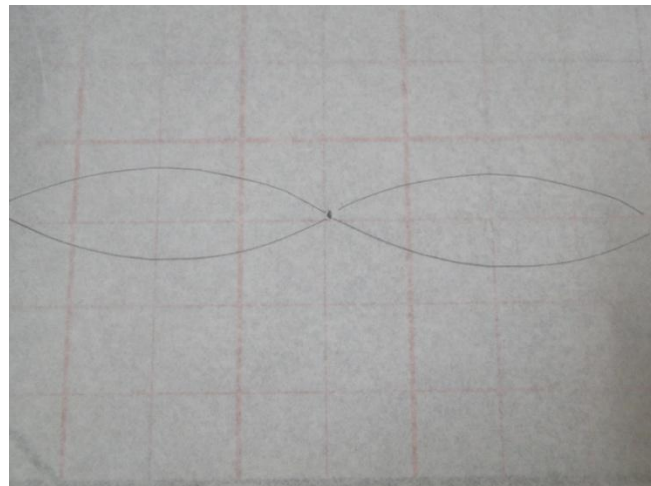


*Trace your petal pattern onto a piece of paper allowing for a ¼ inch seam allowance. The template with the seam allowance (white) is for cutting your petals.*

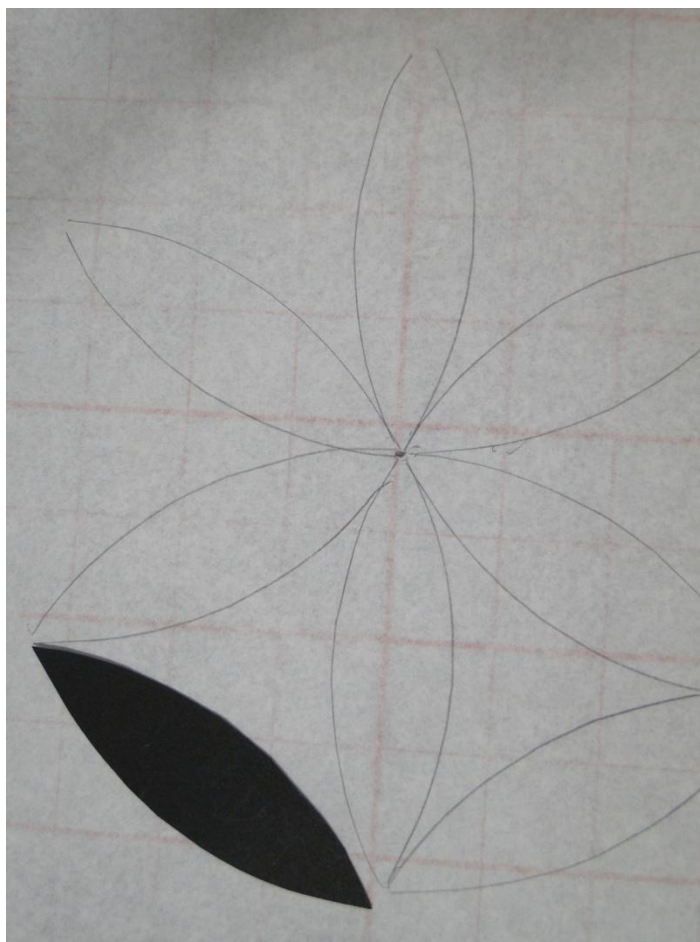


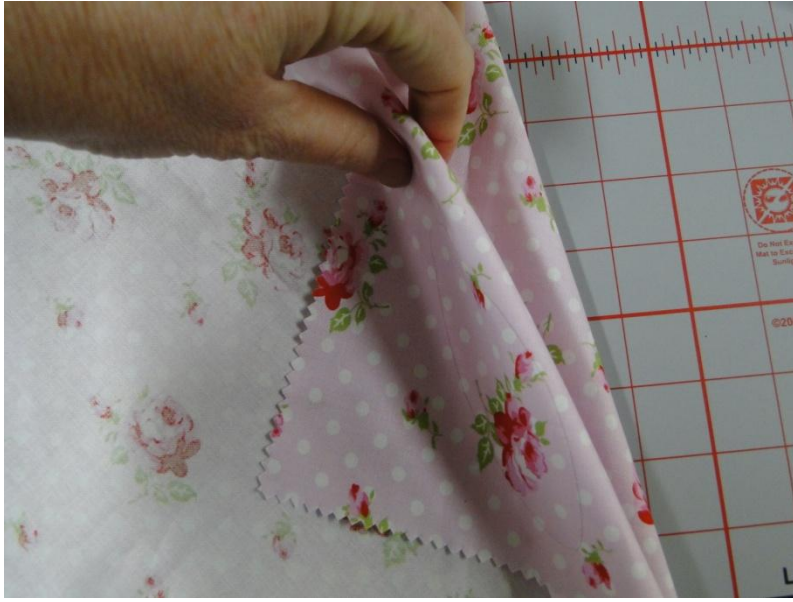
*Trace your petal pattern (black) onto a piece of tissue paper. The tissue paper will be the overlay for your block placement. Notice I have the tissue paper over my cutting mat so I can see the grid lines.*

*Continue tracing the petals and use the lines to make sure your petals are straight and across from one another meeting at the tip.*



*Once you have your petals meeting in the center take your template and trace the rest of your pattern by meeting the tips of each petal.*

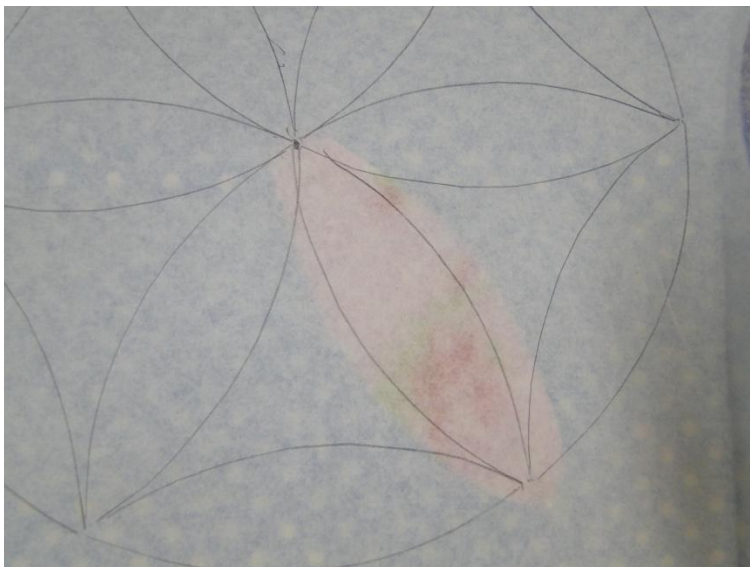




*Fan fold your fabric and place your template (black) over the fabric and cut several petals at one time. If you prefer, you can fussy cut them as well.*

*I used 12 different fabrics for the block above. You can choose any colors or patterns that suit your tastes.*

*Pin the tissue paper over your background fabric.*



*Place one petal under your tissue paper using the markings on your tissue paper for correct placement.*

*Lift the tissue paper and pin the petal at each end.*



*Turn back the fabric on the petal  $\frac{1}{4}$  inch and tack it with your needle and thread without stitching it to the background.*

*Fold the tissue paper back over your petal to be sure you have turned it back enough and it lines up with your pattern. When it is aligned, commence stitchin'.*
