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### FABRIC REQUIREMENTS:

Fabric A – Dark Aqua Batik	Fat 1/8
Fabric B – Light Blue Batik	Fat 1/8
Fabric C – Medium Aqua Batik	Fat 1/8
Fabric D – Light Aqua	Fat 1/8
Fabric E – Dark Blue	Fat 1/8
Fabric F – White	Fat 1/8



### CUTTING:

From Fabrics A-D, cut:

- (1) 5 1/4" x WOF strip. Sub-cut strip into (1) 5 1/4" square, Cut the square across both diagonals to make (4) small triangles.
- Note: You will only need one triangle from each fabric.*
- (1) 4 7/8" square. Cut the square across one diagonal to make (2) large triangles.
- (1) 2 1/2" x 4 1/2" strip.
- (2) 2 1/2" squares.

From Fabrics E, cut:

- (1) 2 1/2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut strip into (8) 2 1/2" squares.

From Fabrics F, cut:

- (1) 4 1/2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut strip into (4) 2 1/2" x 4 1/2" strip.

### Assembly Instructions:

1. Place (1) Fabric A large triangle on top of (1) Fabric B large triangle, right sides together. Sew the (2) triangles together along the long side to make one AB corner unit (Fig. 1).
2. Follow Figure 2 and use the remaining large triangles to make the following corner units: (1) BC corner unit, (1) CD corner Unit and (1) DA corner unit.

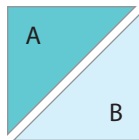

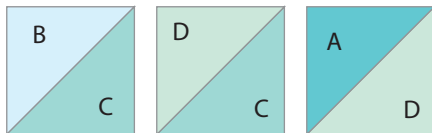

3. Place one 2 1/2" Fabric E square on the left side of one 2 1/2" x 4 1/2" Fabric A strip, right sides together. Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner. Flip open the triangle formed and press (Fig. 3). Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle leaving a 1/4" seam allowance.

4. Place another 2 1/2" Fabric E square on the right side of the 2 1/2" x 4 1/2" Fabric A strip, right sides together. Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner. Flip open the triangle formed and press (Fig. 4). Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle leaving a 1/4" seam allowance.

5. Repeat Steps 3-4 and follow Figure 5 to make one of each flying goose unit.

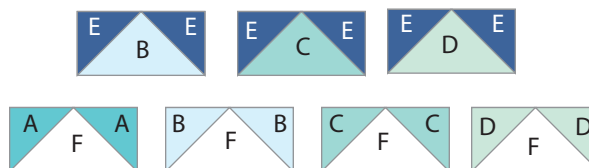

6. Sew together one Fabric A, B, C and D small triangles to make the center block (Fig. 6).

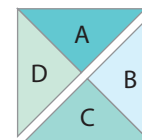
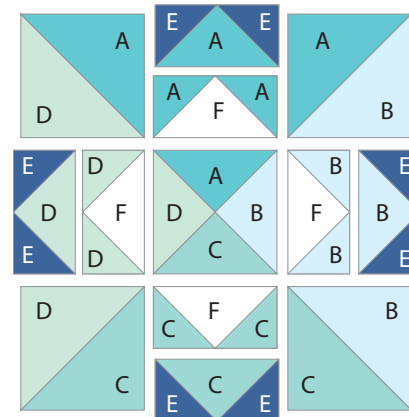

7. Follow the Block Layout to sew the units together to make the 12 1/2" x 12 1/2" block.
